

# Aviation Training Centre opens in Shannon

#### By Arthur Quinlan, in Limerick

THE Minister of State at the De-partment of Transport, Energy and Communications, Mr Emmet Stagg, yesterday opened the Irish Aviation Authority's Training Centre at the Shannon Business

The centre will provide opportunities for consultancy training services in the international markets, particularly in Eastern Europe and the Far and Middle East.

Mr Stagg said the development came shortly after an an-nouncement that £23.5 million was to be spent on expanding facilities at Shannon Airport. It was, he said, further evidence of the Government's appreciation of the importance of aviation in the mid-west region.

The new centre becomes the headquarters of the authority's training activities providing both initial and up-date courses for communications, engineering and air traffic control staff.

In the coming year, more than 260 persons will undergo training at the centre. The Irish Aviation Authority is responsible for the management of Irish controlled air space and the regulation of aviation safety standards.

Mr Jim Lacey, chairman of the authority, said: "A major part of the business is located at Shannon and already additional business is being brought to the Shannon region by concentrating the training of air traffic control staff by bringing in students from

The authority has more than 320 staff members located in Co Clare between the airport and the Communications Centre at Ballygirreen, which has been the radio communications centre for transatlantic aviation for over 50

### Pig producers criticise fees

Pig and poultry produce have criticised the new licen ing regulations drawn up by th Environmental Protectio Agency. Producers will have pay up to £7,000 for a licence t operate a large pig or poultr

The new regulations, which come into force from Septembe 3rd, will cost a small unit owne £2,500, according to Mr Lian Ryan, chairman of the IFA pig-committee. Mr Ryan said the fees would hinder a Forbair plan to encourage producers to enlarge the sector by one million extra pigs by the year

## Farmers to get £14m over BSE

The Department of Agriculture has extended the closing date for acceptance of applica-tions for BSE compensation to this day week because of the number of applicants.

Farmers are to receive EUfunded payments for cattle sold since March 25th, when the BSE crisis drove down the price of animals. Under this scheme beef farmers will receive direct payments of nearly £14 million.
