OVER 300 delegates from all over the world were in Shannon this weekend for a special conference to mark the 50th anniversary of airport duty-free shopping.

The conference – organised by Aer Rianta – has as its theme "Look to the Future" and celebrates the opening of the world's first airport duty free shop at Shannon airport in 1947.

The weekend celebrations also focused on the future of the duty free industry and in particular the threat to intra-EU sales after 1999.

The Mayor of Limerick, Cllr Kieran O'Hanlon, greeted the delegates at the University of Limerick this Monday morning at a conference chaired by Aer Rianta chief executive Derek Keogh.

The conference was addressed by Transport Minister, Alan Dukes; Liam Skelly former DG of Aer Rianta; Heribert Diehl, from Gebr. Heinmann in Germany; Richard Bur-



Conference chairman, Derek Keogh, Aer Rianta's chief executive, said that Aer Rianta took particular pride in the success of what is now a multi-billion pound duty free industry.
