McMaguire said at Killinane Court, when he dismissed dangerous driving charges against two drivers whose vehicles collided at Ballynami, on June 24 last.

The charges against Patrick McGrath, a tractor driver of Darragh, Glencree, and Anthony Heffernan, Ballygreennan, Killinane whose car struck the trailer of the tractor, were dismissed.

Said Justice Maguire: "How this accident arose I don't know. There is no evidence of the manner in which these vehicles were being driven."

Patrick McGrath said that he saw the car coming, pulled in on the grass margin and slowed to a halt. The car had passed the tractor when he heard the bang and saw the trailer "going upside down."

He admitted that there were no lights on the tractor. Anthony Heffernan said that he saw the two lights of the tractor and dimmed his own lights and slowed down. He was about a yard from the ditch when he hit the trailer.

Garda J. Kelly said that the point of impact was roughly in the middle of the road. He found the trailer on its side leaning on the ditch and the car was also up against the ditch on the other side.

"This will have to be dealt with in the civil court," said Justice Maguire.
