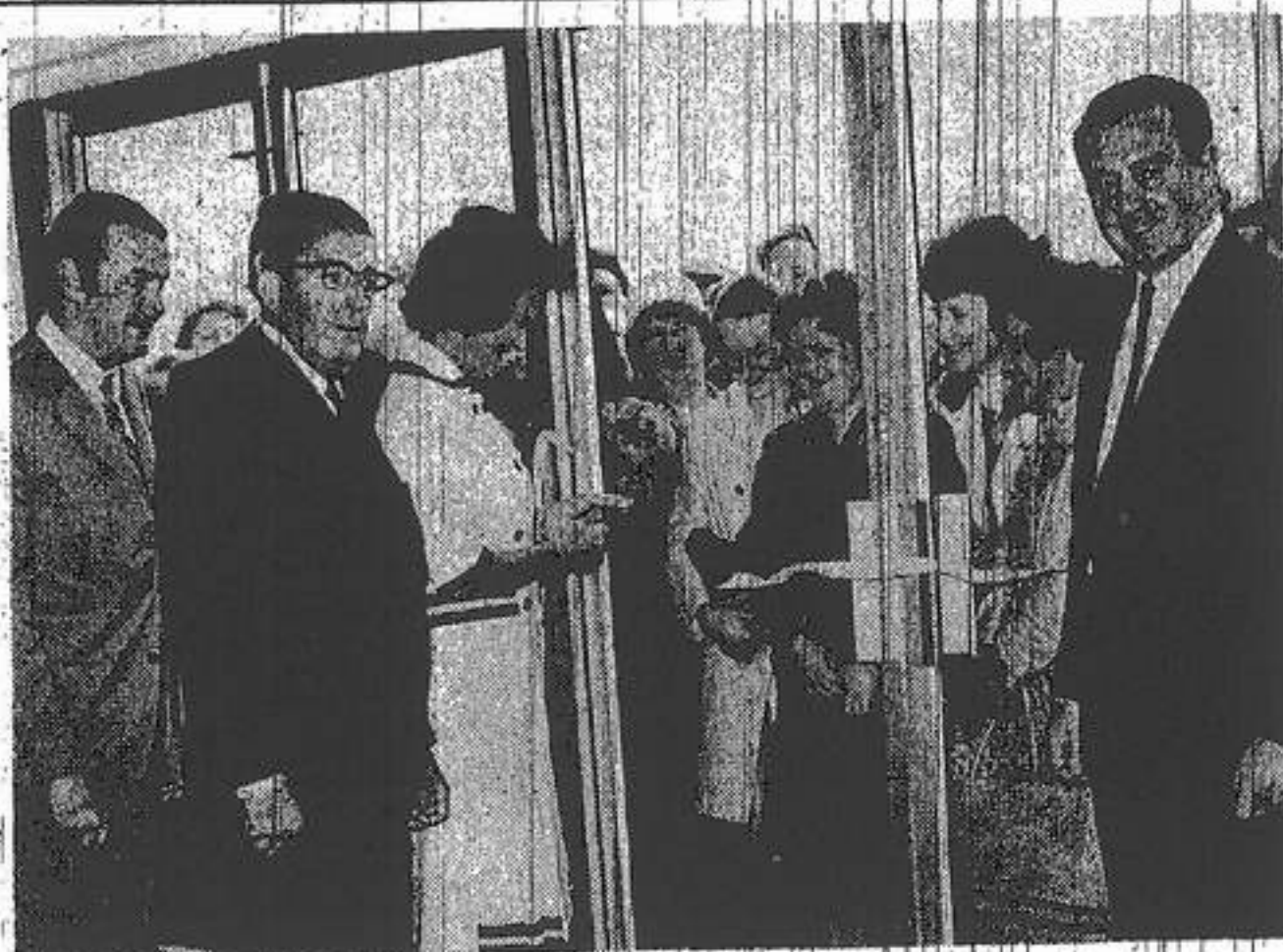

Another row brewing at Shannon

A row is brewing up at Shannon Airport over the planned closing of the architects' section of the Department of Transport and Power of the Airport.

Work from this section is now being transferred to Department's headquarters, Kildare Street, Dublin. At present two architects, four assistants and one clerk of the works are engaged at Shannon. It is understood they will all become redundant later this year.

The section was originally established at Shannon to cope with extra work during the construction of £3,000,000 terminal building. Since then the staff was engaged in various other works in the region.

Mr. Ml. O'Gorman, chairman, of the Shannon Action Committee, said the planned closing of the section showed another weakness in the Government's decentralisation policy.

Hurt

Actor Richard Burton hurt his leg yesterday when a shell exploded during the shooting of a Yugoslav film on the life of President Tito. Burton, who plays Tito in the film, was swept on to a rock by a wave caused by the exploding shell during a scene depicting Tito's partisans fording a river under Nazi attack during World War II.

Dunnes new shopping centre is opened

THE DUNNES STORES organisation, which has a chain of 39 shops spread throughout the country, justified their confidence in the future development of Limerick city yesterday when they officially opened the Jetland Shopping Centre on the Ennis Rd.

The opening ceremony was performed by Mrs. Nora Dunne, a native of Abbeyfeale, County Limerick, wife of Mr. Ben Dunne, chairman. Among the big attendance were Mr. Frank Dunne, managing-director; Mr. Dan Barrett, a director; Mr. Alex Noonan, manager of the Jetland Shopping Centre; Mr. Frank Bowen, secretary, Cork area; and Mr. Ollie Freeney, the ex-Dublin footballer, secretary, Dublin area.

Huge crowd

A huge crowd gathered outside before the doors opened, and within minutes the vast store, which covers an area of 15,000 square feet, was crowded.

The whole complex has been re-planned to comprise a food-market, fresh meat section and drapery on the ground floor, while on the balcony are such facilities as newsagents, chemist, TV rentals, music market, hardware and household utensils, jewellery, travel agent, florist, just to mention a few.

Every facility is available to the shopper, highlighted by the provision of a very spacious car park which accommodates up to 1,000 cars.

Employment

Mr. Ben Dunne, chairman, at a champagne reception in the Limerick Intercontinental Hotel, said that Dunnes Stores Organisation, which recently took over Bolger Stores shops, gave employment to over 350 people in Limerick.

A native of Rostrevor, County Down, Mr. Dunne said that he opened his first shop in Cork away back in 1944 and the third store was located in Limerick. Dunnes Stores, he said, was an
