St. John's Church.

THE removal of the old wall round St. John's burial ground, and erecting in its place an iron railing, has lately been advocated by men of every class and creed; and the Church wardens of the parish, influenced by opinions so very generally expressed and a desire to afford all the aid in their power to promote the work in question—have taken up the matter, and now appeal to the public for pecuniary support. It is, however, almost an universal feeling that men are more apt to advocate an improvement than willing to contribute towards it, and it now remains to be seen whether it shall be so in this case or not. Those who have relatives and friends buried within the enclosure are most anxious to see the place improved, and owners of property in the neighbourhood in like manner must feel deeply interested, because every improvement made enhances its value. It is hoped, therefore, that persons so interested will come forward with liberal donations; And, viewing the improvement on public grounds, it is the duty of all to subscribe, because it is an admitted fact that the old wall in question disfigures the locality in which it is situated. And if the parishioners of St. John, and others more or less interested, do not now assist, they will have to blame themselves if the old wall is not removed, and therefore forward it shall remain a monument of their apathy and want of good taste.
