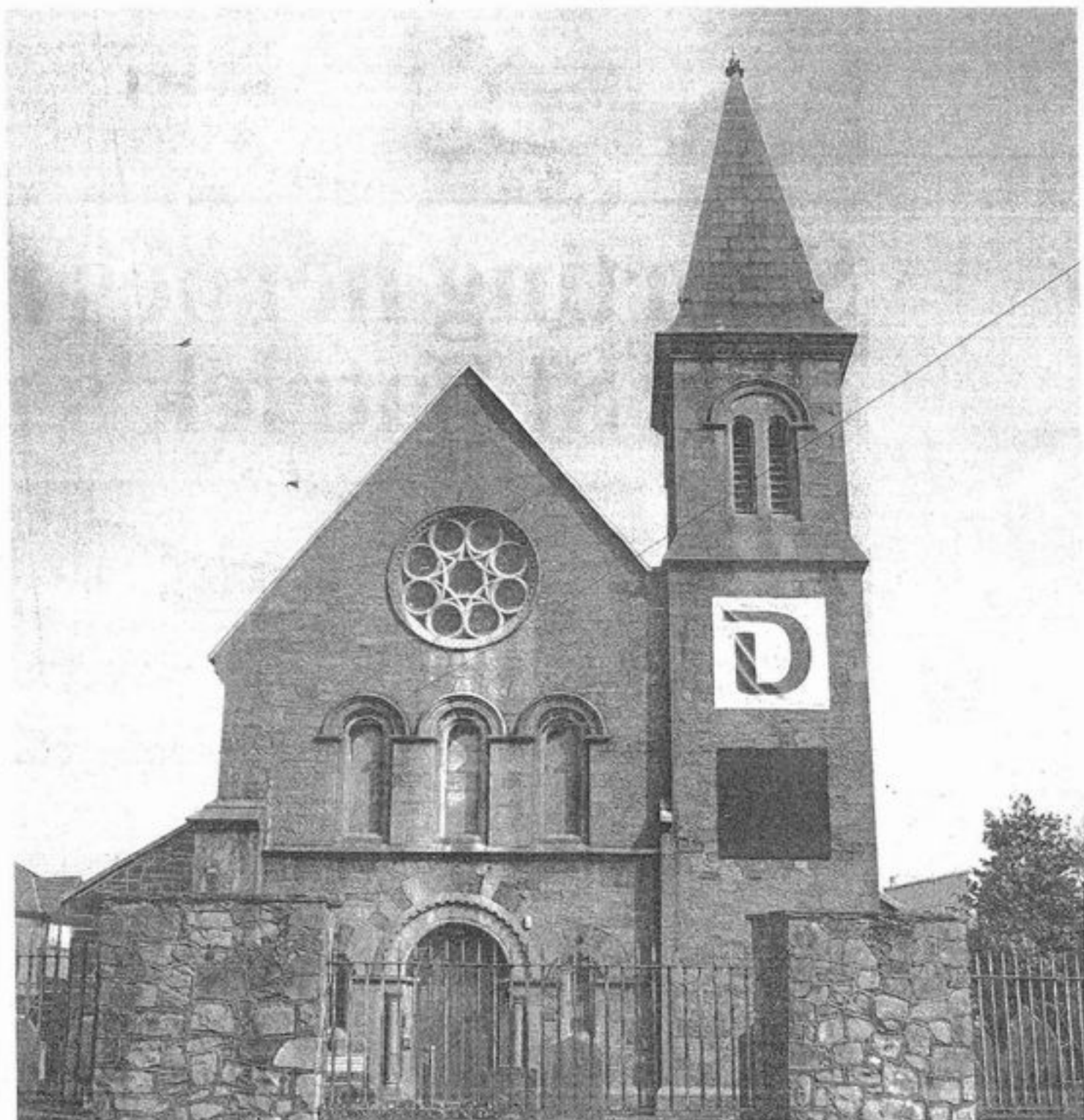

exhibition next year and hopefully in the meantime we will be putting in place the plan we submitted to them, which involves

the restructuring of the organisation."

Other arts organisations in Limerick have generally reported similar levels of

funding from last year, with the Beiltable Arts Centre receiving just a one percent cut, the Irish Chamber Orchestra

suffering a seven percent cut, while Limerick Printmakers received similar levels of funding to last year. Limerick City

Council received a similar grant to last year, while the Limerick City Gallery of Art received a slight increase.
