**THE WILL OF THE LATE WILLIAM PRICE.**

The will, dated February 2, 1891, of the late William Price, of Llantrissant, Glamorgan, surgeon, "Arch-druid of Wales," who died in January last, aged 92 years, has been proved by the sole executrix and trustee, Miss Gwennlian Llewellyn. The testator by his will ordered:—"When I shall cease to be in my present tenement called or baptized by the name of William Price, my trustee shall take up my old tenement, clothed as a he shall find it, and shall put it up in a sitting position in the old chair of my uncle, Hugh Jones, and deposit it within the triangle on Caeyr Laan upon one cord of wood and two tons of coal," which were to be saturated with paraffin and set on fire at noonday, and when not an atom remained the dust was to be sown within the triangle so that grass and natural flowers might grow. When the testator's two children die, he desired their bodies to be cremated. All his books are to be held in trust for his two children, "Jesu Grist (Jesus Christ) and Penelope Elizabeth, and their descendants for ever, Amen, Amen, Amen." The value of the testator's personal estate was under £100.
