

NOTICE BY THE REVENUE COMMISSIONERS

WHOLESALE TAX REGISTRATION

The linister for Finance has made an Order appointing the day of August. 1966, as the appointed day for the purpose of Station for the Wholesale Tax. The Wholesale Tax will come operation on the last October, 1966.

Firster who will be accountable for Wholesale Tax must her with the Revenue Commissioners within 9 days after the Mitted day. Forms of application for Wholesale Tax registion (Form No. W.T.1) are available at the Office of the State Comerai, Aras Brugha, 9-10 Upper O'Connell St., Dublin, at the offices of Inspectors of Taxes.

Wholesalers and Manufacturers of Taxable Goods

You MUST register

goods (other than motor cars and as sembly parts) by wholesale and your receipts from whole-sale sales of Taxable goods (other than motor cars and assembly parts) exceed 5500 in any month; or if you are a manufacturer of Taxable goods and your re-ceipts from sales of Taxable goods exceed £150 in any month


Large Retailers


Exemptions from Wholesale Tax


