EVEN without a Player-Manager, Limerick A.F.C. are determined not to let their supporters down tomorrow when they meet Cork Hibernians in the Shield at the Markets Field, writes Tony Purcell.

It is a tough time for the officials of Limerick A.F.C. at the moment. On top of having the team going through a bad spell, they have been forced to put Alan Fox on the transfer list at his own request and stripped him of his managerial duties.

Despite a fee of £900 on his head, Fox will be at centre-half tomorrow, flanked by Al Finucane and Joe O'Mahony. Johnny Ryan and Joe Bourke are the full-backs. Peter Mitchell leads the forward line with Tony Aherne, who has signed professional forms with the club, and Andy McEvoy, the inside-forwards.

Cork Hibernians have been

more impressive since the start of the season and must be favourites for the points tomorrow. If the Limerick defence can manage to subdue dangerous Carol Davenport, David Wiggington and Amby Fogarty, then they could pave the way for the first Shield win.

A big improvement, however, on recent form will be necessary, I would appeal to soccer followers to give the club the support necessary to get them over their present plight.

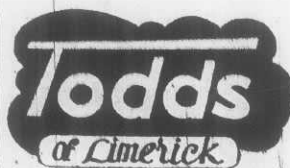
