Kevin Fitzpatrick is Limerick A.F.C.'s new player-manager for the 1973-74 season.
His appointment was confirmed at & Press conference this morning.
Kevin, a commercial traveller with Messrs, Gallabers Ltd., the well-known tobacco company, made his debut with Limerick in 1958, when he starred in their 3-3 draw against Glasgow Celtic,
The same year he played hurling and Gaelic football with Limerick CBS.
He has been with Limerick fourteen years, and served his apprenticeship with the club's youth squad.

his appointment, Kevin had this to say: "All I can do is my very best, and it is my wish to make Limerick into one of the best teams in the land."

Mr. Billy Higgins, vice-chairman, said that his board had every confidence in Mr. Fitzpatrick, and added that he would have their full support.

RESPONSIBLE

The new player-manager will be responsible for all team affairs, including the signing of players. It is also his intention to field a "B" team, probably in the Munster Senior League. He will be in charge of training and team selection.

Fitzpatrick emphasised that he would be concentrating mainly on an all-local team.

In this respect, he asked that junior clubs might cooperate with him.

To date, only four players have re-signed for the 1973/74 season, which gets under way on Sunday week. They are Des Kennedy, Denis Lymer, Richte Hall and Fitzpatrick.

All the players have been offered an increase in wages, but a number of them are holding out for better terms.

"I will be having a chat with the remainder of our panel over the next few days and am hopeful that all of them will be signed in time for our initial League-Cup match against Shelbourne," remarked Kevin, who is travelling to Dublin at the weekend to meet Shay Doyle, Sean Core and Johnny Murray.

Kevin has no immediate plans to introduce outside talent, even though Mr. Higgins hinted that money would be available if the right men came on the market
