A few words of timely advice to followers of Limerick AFT — do not be expecting any miracles in season 1975-76. This week, newly appointed PRO, Mr. John Murnane, outlined the club's policy for the next nine months, and he said little to suggest that better days were ahead.

At a time when most League of Ireland clubs are husily engaged in friendlies in preparation for the big kick-off in mid-September, the locals have been strangely subdued.

Several cross-channel teams have visited Ireland in the past fortnight but Limerick was not included in their itinerary. There has been news of signings and transfers, but again the blues have been noticeable by their absence from the gossip columns.

Don't worry. Limerick will definitely have a team in the League of Ireland next term ... but as stated at the outset, the odds are that it will be another mediocre season for Jac O'Mahony and Co.

The directors are keeping to the promise they made a couple of months ago that the emphasis is to be on an all-local panel. Said Mr. Murnane: "Funds are low and we have to cut down on ex-

penses. Accordingly, we are compelled to reduce our weekly wage bill and this means that we will be concentrating on developing our own talent."
