EIGHTY-FIVE E.S.B. workers based in Rosbrien refused to go to work this morning as members of the AT & GWU continued their picket.

When the picket was first placed on Tuesday about 150 workers including members of the Electrical Trade Union refused to pass.

However, an E.S.B. spokesman said the majority of E.T.U. workers passed the picket this morning, leaving about 85 who did not.

These men involved include linesmen, drivers and store keepers. The men are objecting to moves by management to put the appliance sales on a viable footing.

It is understood that the workers are objecting to changes in the schedules and different storage arrangements.

The E.S.B. spokesman said the changes in schedules would result in no redundancies. Money was being lost and changes had to be made. This was happening nationwide.

The spokesman confirmed that there was no danger to supplies because of the dispute.

The AT and GWU dispute is official and is nationwide.

Investigation by Gardai into soccer lottery

 Gardai at Henry Street have confirmed they are investigating a lottery being promoted to help finance Limerick City's proposed plans for the

Rathbane grounds. A special team under the direction of Inspector Eugene Lynch have launched an investigation into the lottery, which offers £3,000 prize money weekly.

The Gardai believe the lottery may be in contravention of the Gaming and Lottery Act, 1956, and if necessary they will prosecute.

But Mr. Hayman Harris, Commercial Manager for Limerick City A.F.C. said that they had their homework done and had been advised that they were within their rights in going ahead.

Mr. Harris claimed that they had researched the law aspect of the lottery before it was launched.

Continued Mr. Harris: "This was not an overnight decision by us. We started the groundwork last November and went into all the details most thoroughly."

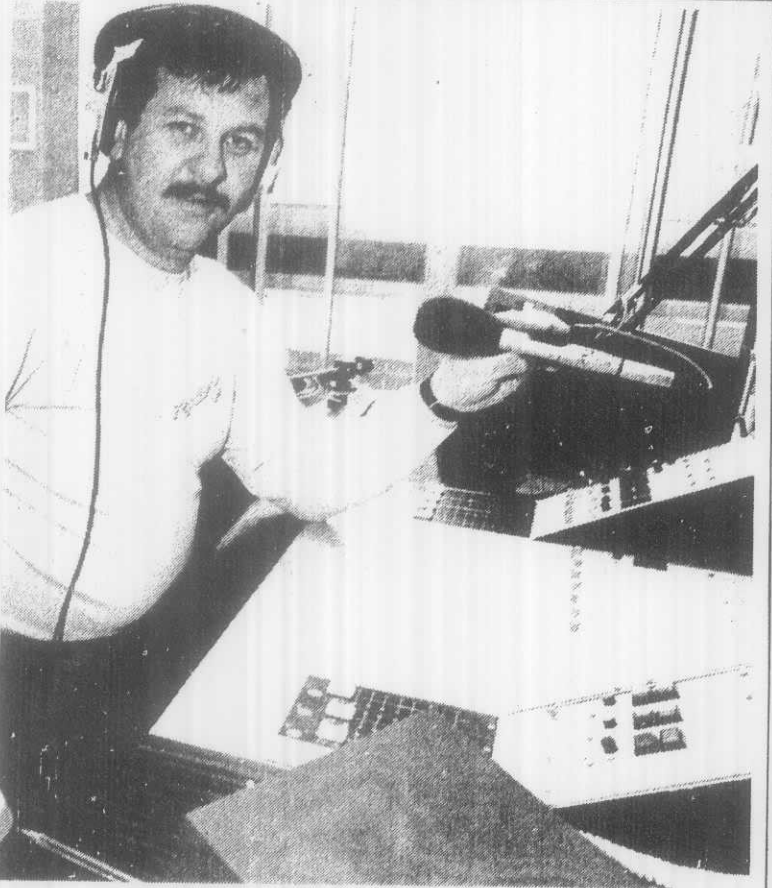
He confirmed that they had been approached by the Garda last week, as had several of their prizewinners to date.
