PROBE The scene of the crash at Ballyneety OCRA

MAJOR investigation under way this Monday by Gar-dai and CIE into last night's Pike Rovers bus crash in which a former club chairman, Mr. Tony Hanley (48) of St. Laurences Park, Ballysimon Road, died and 49 were injured.

This Monday afternoon nine of the injured were serious of whom four are in critical condition at the Regional Hospital. Among the critically injured is 5 year old Paul Mulally son of Fran Mulally of 16 Plassey Avenue, Corbally who is also in Intensive Care in Barringtons Hospital. Mr. Mulally, team

manager, is "comfortable". In all 37 of the injured are being treated at Limerick Regional and 12 are detained in Barring-

Limerick Regional and 12 are detained in Barringtons.

The CIE luxury coach bringing the Pike team, supporters from Midleton where they had played a Munster Junior Cup quarter final went out of control on what Gardai said is "a reasonably straight" stretch of road, a hundred yards on the city side of the Catscradle pub in Ballyneety. The accident occured shortly before 9 p.m.

One of the injured passengers Mr. Frank Hanrahan of Norwood Park told me: "I don't know what happened. I was in the middle of the bus".

A CIE Bus Eireann spokesman said this Monday that initial examination of the bus showed that it was mechanically sound.

"The steering, brakes, and wheels were in order.
There was nothing like a a blow out", said Mr. Jim
Custy regional manager, Bus Eireann.

It was learned this afternoon that only two of the five in intensive care at the Regional Hospital were serious: 5-year-old Pau. Mullally, who was inis afternoon transferred to Cork Regional Hospital, and Paul O'Shea, of 43 Bengal Terrace. The remaining three in Intensive Care were "stable."

"How low can you go, these people were in a distressed enough stage without this happening", said Mr. Pat

Lynch, who lives in Cast-letroy.

He said that one of the cars rie said that one of the cars was later found crashed in the city. Mr. Lynch paid tribute to the staff in both hospitals. He described as despicable the robbery of the cars by "young seams".
