That was in 1971 at Dalymount Park when in a constant Thursday night drizzle, they defeated Drogheda United 3-0.

Just like last Saturday's rugby success in Cardiff, it was a wonderful occasion for Limerick fans and one that still lingers with us today.

The team had drawn the first tie 0-0 at the same venue the previous Sunday and there were plenty of tired limbs on both sides as Drogheda threatened to take the lead in the first half of the

keep Limerick level at the break and with the dark-ness quickly descending on Phibsboro and the drizzle deteriorating into a heavy mist, Limerick suddenly stepped up a

A brilliant pass from Paddy Short put centre forward Davy Barrett through, 1-0 to Limerick and the Blue party was already underway. Limer-ick were now playing as if their very lives depended on the outcome with Al Finucane, Tony Meaney, Shamie Coad and Andy McEvoy dominating the midfield.

Two late goals from Scot Hughie Hamilton made him a household name and Al Finucane fought his way through a blue and white throng to mount the stand and lift the cup for the first time in Limerick soccer histo-
