DOYLE, FITZPATRICK ON SIDE TO MEET SCOTLAND

LIMERICK'S amateur trio for the lucrative trip to Whitley Bay next week have punched in their final hours of training, and two of them—Kevin Fitzpatrick and Mick Doyle—are included in the side for the opening game against Scotland on Wednesday.

For goalkeeper Fitzpatrick it is indeed an unexpected honour. Seven weeks ago he was just another player on the Shannon-siders books, but then came his big break in the two concluding league games against Waterford. He fared competently in the Markets Field tie but on Easter Monday he played an inspired ninety minutes at Kilcohan Park and this earned him a place on the panel. Then came "break" number two when last night he was on the side beaten one-nil by Drumcondra and fared well. When the selectors met subsequently they had no alternative but to pick the man in form and well does the former Reds United custodian deserve the honour.

SECOND "CAP" FOR DOYLE

It will be "cap" number two for inside-left Mick Doyle. One of the most promising players in the League of Ireland last season, he gained his first against England, and was a scorer in the shock two-all tie that day. He, too, was in excellent trim last night and carved out many excellent chances for his colleagues. He is fully deserving of this second chance when the sides meet at Bishop Auckland.

Joe O'Brien was unable to take his place last night but is a travelling reserve and it is almost certain that he will be called into action during the tournament.

Ewan Fenton will be in charge of the party which leaves on Tuesday next and Limerick can be justly proud of its representatives. They can be guaranteed not to let the side down.
