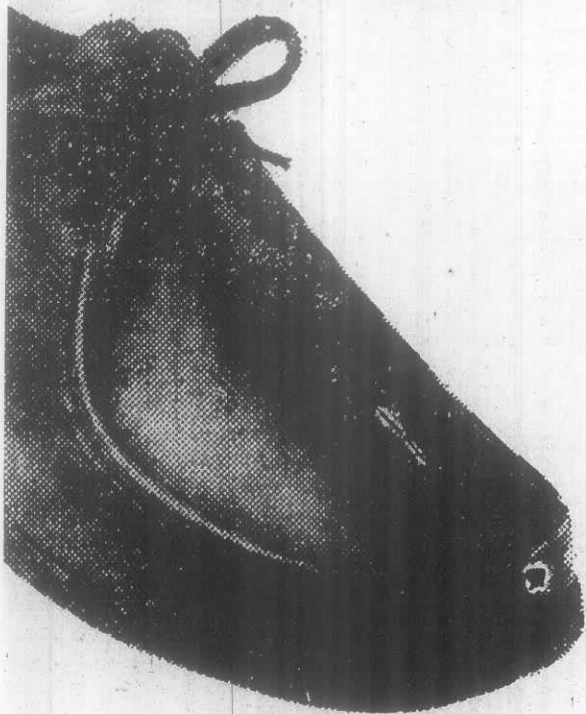

Charges

Two Englishmen pleaded not guilty at the court to breaking into the home of Mr. Lillingston on July 3rd last and to stealing a quantity of silver, value £3,787. They were John Cartwright (26), 6 St. Stephen's Avenue, Sheppard's Bush, London, and Robert John Irvine (25) of the same address.

His father, Dan, was an outstanding hurler, and won a number of county championship medals with Ahane, and also played with distinction with Limerick.

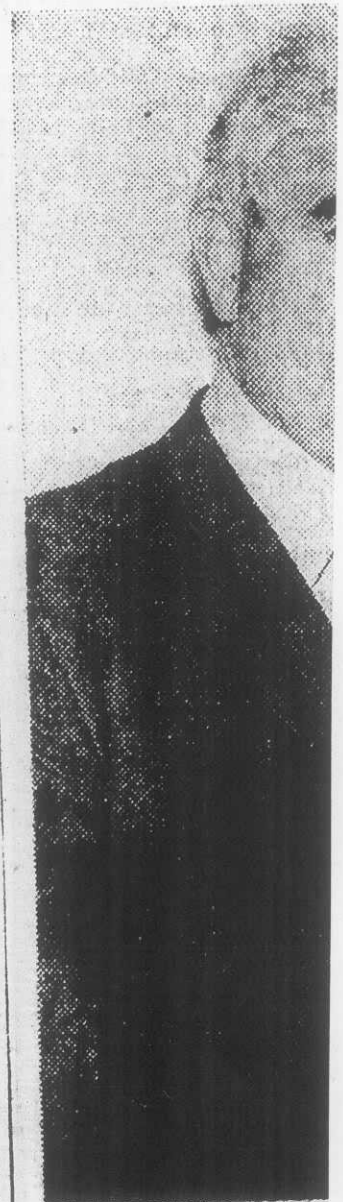
DEATH
