Soccer: Great Limerick Player Calls It A Day

Tommy Hamilton Hangs up his boots

Grateful to Limerick for their attitude

Tommy Hamilton, Limerick's 33-year-old inside-forward, has decided to retire from football after a most distinguished career.

Hamilton is to be married on February 8th and after thirteen years in top-class football feels the time has come to leave the game. Hamilton expresses his deepest appreciation of the way he has been treated by Limerick who "regretfully" informed him by letter that they would accede to his wishes to retire. He will turn out once more for the "Blues"—in a special benefit game at the end of the season which the club is to arrange in his interests.

Hamilton started his soccer career at the age of 14 with Cualawn Rovers, a Dublin team which also included Andy McEvoy and Alan Kelly. He moved from there to Johnville, with whom he won an F.A.I. Cup medal at minor level. Manchester United showed an interest in him at this stage, and he was signed by Sir Matt Busby, playing in their reserve team for 3 seasons and gaining a number of honours with them.

Tommy pays a rich tribute to United Manager, Sir Matt Busby. "He is the most wonderful man in football. He has a wonderful understanding of his has suffered an injury over the week-end, Sir Matt Busby knows of it and always makes a point of inquiring after his interests," he says.

He played with United from '52 to '54, and then came back to Dublin to play with Shamrock Rovers, with whom he was to win every honour the game could offer. He has two F.A.I. Cup medals. He won the first in 1956 when he scored the first goal in a sensational come-back by Rovers against Cork Athletic, and the second in '62 "in my best game for Rovers. I scored twice in a 4-1 beating of Shelbourne. I never keep tally of the awards which I have won, but I have 3 League medals, 3 Shield and a number of Leinster and Dublin City Cup medals. In addition, I have had two full international and 28 inter-league caps."

After his eight years with Rovers, he played for Cork Hibernians and Limerick, figuring with both clubs in unsuccessful Cup finals. He sees a big future for the game in this country.

"The standard has levelled off this season; the introduction of top-class English coaches is a good thing, although local players should be encouraged as much as possible; after all, they are often better than the cross-Channel material."
