Twenty-four year-old Mick Kemmy, a star full back with Limerick and Pike Rovers a few years back, has, for the past five seasons, been playing great football with the American Soccer League club, Falls River, Mass. His team recently beat Club Madeirense, of New Bedford, 2-0, and are now in line to carry off the New England Open Championship for the third time
