Death of ex-Limerick soccer star

Widespread regret has been expressed in Limerick sporting circles at the death of Michael Kemmy, former Limerick soccer star and Irish youth captain, at Bristol, Rhode Island, Massachusetts, on Wednesday.

Michael Kemmy, who began his soccer playing with Pike Rovers, played for three seasons with Limerick A.F.C. in the League of Ireland and the F.A.I. Cup, at the end of the 1950s; he was an outstanding full-back. Picked three times for Ireland's youth soccer team, he captained the Irish youth team on one occasion.

Michael Kemmy, who emigrated to the U.S., where he became a supermarket manager; is survived by his wife Joan, two young sons and a daughter.

He is also survived by his mother, Mrs. Elizabeth Kemmy, and his brothers, James and Joe Kemmy, and his sisters, Mrs. D. McAteer and Mrs. Joe Harnett.
