

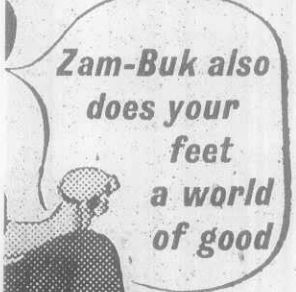

THE Limerick soccer team returned from Dalymount Park, Dublin, yesterday with something better to cheer them than drawing 2-2 with Bohemians. What mattered most was the excellent debut of 16 year-old Vincent Prendergast in goal.

THE match at Dalymount Park, Dublin, yesterday between Bohemians and Limerick produced a hero, writes "Spectator." He was the youngest player on the field—Vincent Prendergast, 16-year-old goalkeeper. He saved several strong shots and headers in a manner that made the Limerick management look upon him as a "find." The Limerick club was in a quandary in mid-week because Christy Collopy, out through injury, was still not available and his deputy, Mick Crowe, was unable to make the trip to Dalymount. After a trial match, schoolboy Prendergast was selected to play for Limerick and his first appearance in top grade football was remarkably successful.
