Joe Waters in the news

The success story which Limerick soccer enjoyed recently — United won the League and native Al Finucane guided Waterford to their first FAI Cup win in 42 years — is not over yet.

Garryowen-born Joe Waters is well on his way to carving his own little piece of history. Should Grimsby Town get a point from their league meeting with Sheffield United next Saturday then they will be crowned champions of the Third Division.

They are already assured of promotion to Division 2 — which means that the former Wembley Rovers schoolboy has steered them from the fourth to the second divisions in successive seasons.

This is indeed a remarkable achievement. Waters, now aged 24, was installed as captain of Grimsby in 1977 and is thought to be the first Irishman to captain a promotion winning side for two consecutive years.

He is the darling boy of Grimsby, whose supporters are still wondering what he has to achieve to gain international recognition. Joe, who joined Leicester City from Wembley Rovers as a 15 year-old, has stated that his ambitions are to get the fishing port club back into the First Division, and to stake a permanent spot on the International team.

He had his first appearance in a green jersey in Ankara in 1976 when he scored Ireland's equalising goal against Turkey.

His next call was last November when drafted in as substitute against Northern Ireland, a game which the Republic lost by 1-0.

Waters has been a driving force behind Grimsby's success story. Playing from the half-back position, he has notched many important goals. He has been described as the ideal captain.

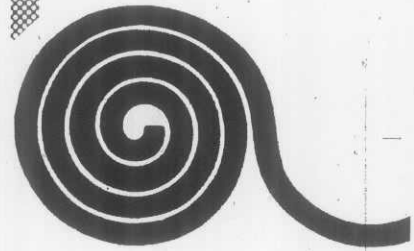
