Television quizmaster Michael Miles, left £102,926 gross, £61,640 nett (duty £24,292) in his will published yesterday.

As far as is possible, I will insist, not as a Dail Deputy, but as one who has been totaly committed for many years to the concept of Higher Education that the Limerick Institute receive not merely recognition, but also international acceptance.

**Health Centre for O'Malley Park**

**T**HE proposed new Health Centre for O'Malley Park, Limerick, should be completed by the end of the year.

This was learned by our reporter who made enquiries at the Mid-West Health Board, today.

Behind the construction of the new single-storey clinic is the National Building Agency, who are also responsible for the erection of the houses and

shopping centre in the area.

There is no estimate yet of what the clinic will cost the Health Board.

If necessary, it will be possible to hold dispensary sessions at this centre as any of the consulting rooms can be used for such a purpose.

This would relieve pressure on the existing dispensary in the city.

If the choice of doctor scheme comes into operation, the accommodation problem in the dispensaries will no longer exist.

The new clinic will be divided broadly into two sections: the consulting rooms and the ancillary space.

In the consulting rooms, there will be facilities for:

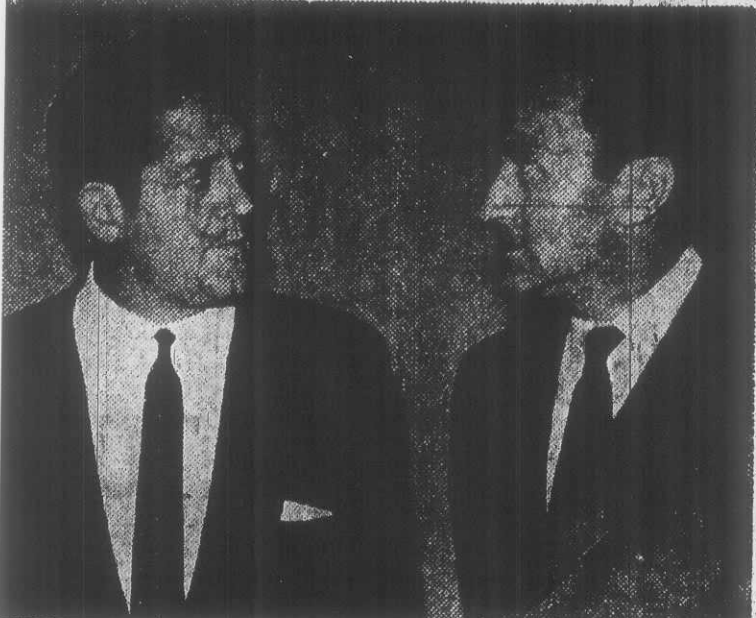
- Child welfare and immunisation.
- Dental, psychiatric and ante-natal treatment.
- Ophthalmic services and ear, nose and throat care, and
- Offices for nurse, social worker and assistance officer.

In the ancillary space, there will be a recovery space, a receptionist, public and staff toilets, pram space and waiting areas, and space for the storage of medical records, bandages, and cleaning equipment.

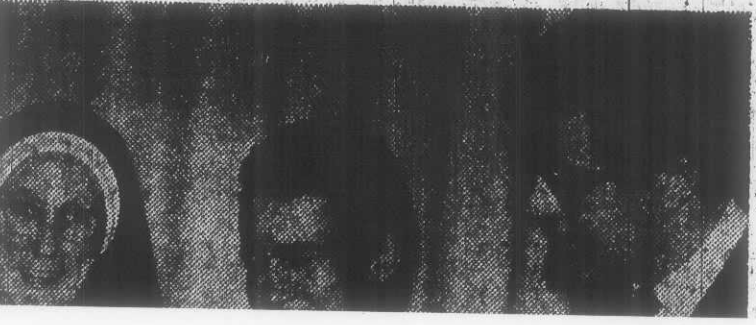
**Audience enthralled**
