### FINED AND DISQUALIFIED

For driving a motor bicycle in Limerick recently without insurance, Martin Hughes, of 18, Hennessy Avenue, Limerick, was fined £5 by Justice Gleeson in the City District Court to-day. Charged also with having no road tax, he was disqualified from driving for three months and fined 20/-.

"Otherwise stiff measures will be taken to ensure that they do," he said.

Nineteen parents were summoned before the Court for not sending their children regularly to school. Fines ranging from £1 to 5/- were imposed, and in some instances the cases were adjourned for two months to see how the children concerned attend school in the meantime.

Their appointments were confirmed by Justice Gleeson in the Limerick District Court to-day on the application of Supt. P. Colleran.

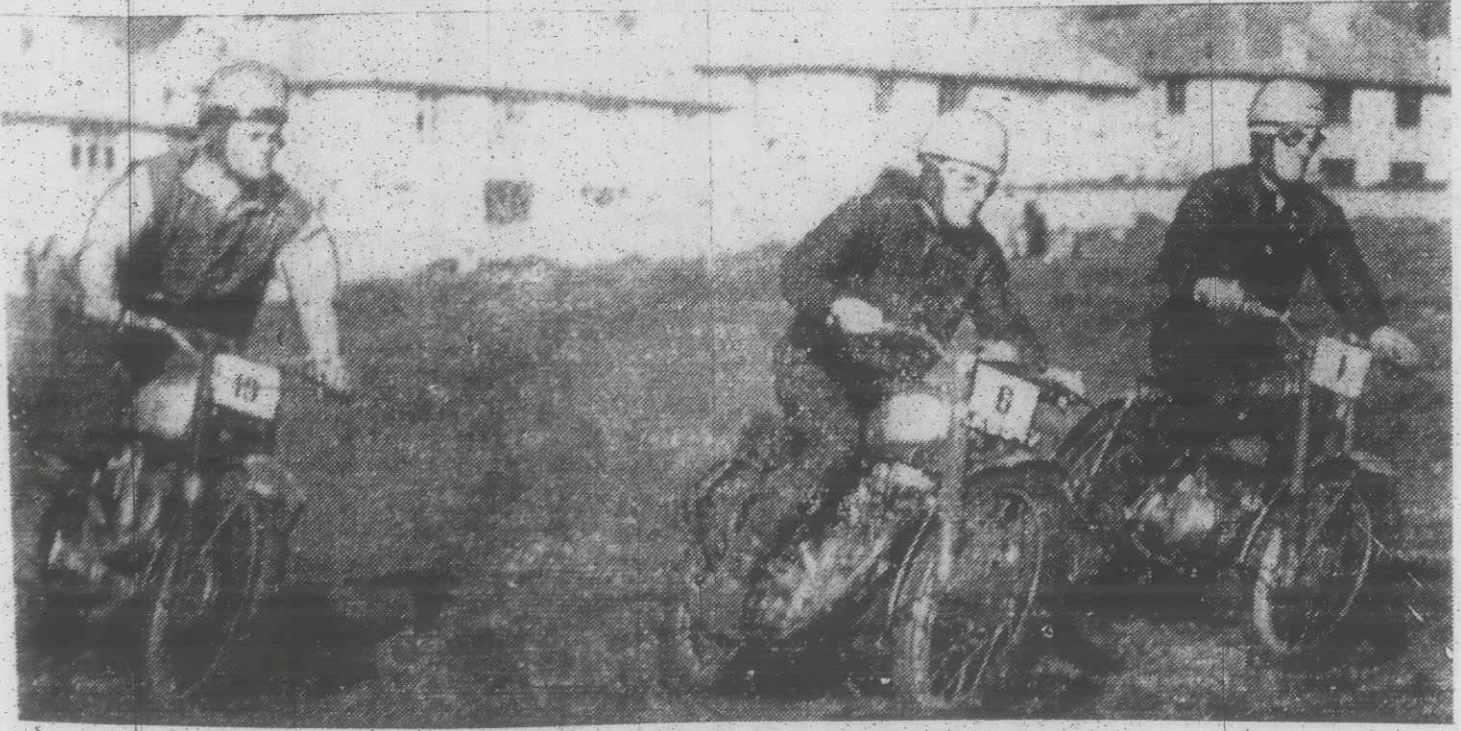
### SOCCER STAR
