## The Hartmann collection goes on show at UL

THE Gerard Hartmann collection of sporting memorabilia at the University of Limerick was officially opened last night by the athlete Dr Ronnie Delany and is now open to the public free of charge. charge.

The Hartmann Collection is the most extensive personal sports collection to be available on public view in the country and contains over 500 pieces, from athletics to horse racing, from GAA to rugby, cycling, triathlon and much more.

Sonia O'Sullivan. Eamonn Coughlan, Keith Wood, Séan Óg OhAilpín and Juliet Murphy all attended the opening this Monday night, many of whom have become friends with the renowned sports physical therapist, Gerard Hart-

mann. "The uniqueness this collection is that it is a private and personal collection with each item being authentic. Each photo and artefact was given to me by a sportsperson who is or was a patient or personal friend of mine. There is a story behind each piece,"

said Mr Hartmann.
Some of the items in the collection include the boots which jockey Kieran Fallon wore when "Dylan Thomas" won the Budweiser Irish Derby in 2006, along with the sash which the horse won to

Séan Óg OhAilpín's jersey in the 2004 All Ireland Hurling Final, in which Cork beat Kilkenny, and the race number which Sonia O'Sullivan wore when she became the first Irish woman to win a World Championship gold medal, in the 5000m in

Gothenburg in 1995, are also on view.

Mr Hartmann has now relocated the Hartmann International Sports Injury Clinic to the University of Limerick Arena but said the winning formula will not change. "Now world class athletes can avail of my expertise with the added bonus of being able to resource the wonderful facilities at the

wonderful facilities at the University Arena, all under one roof," he said.
Prof Don Barry, President of the University of Limerick, believes the venture is a fantastic opportunity for the University Arena and the university as a whole.
