Faces in the crowd

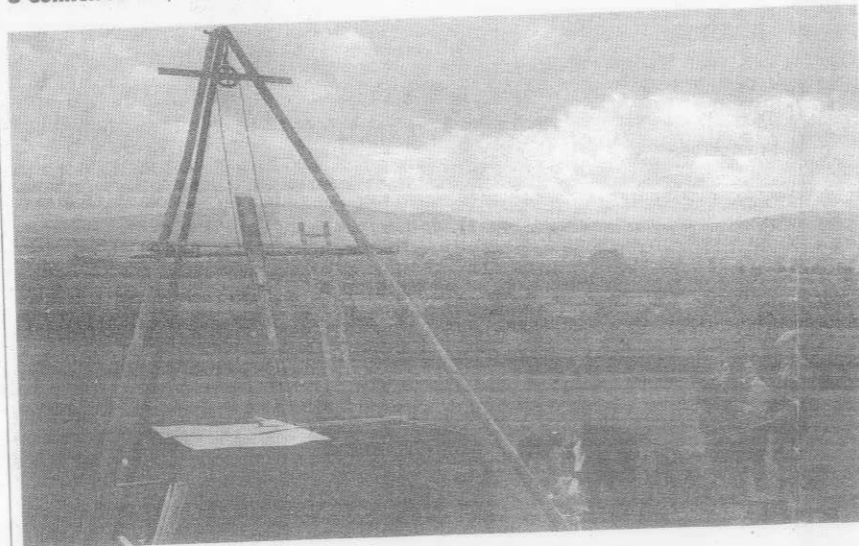

With this amazing electronic device, we are able to make blocks of pictures within minutes. The installation of this machine coincides with the opening of our new art department, which will be under the personal supervision of Mr. Donal MacMonagle, who is rated highly among this country's Press and commercial photographers.

Changes at the Leader In June 1958, almost 50 years ago the Limerick Leader carried banner headlines announcing new ground-breaking photographic technology. We purchased a state of the art scan-a-graver which allowed us to print pictures taken that day. Prior to that, photographs appeared a week after being taken, if at all. The Leader also announced it was giving the people of Limerick a new-look, bigger and brighter and bulkier 18-page weekend Limerick Leader. In the 50 years since those headlines were written, the Leader has taken on many new faces and this weekend it takes another big step forward. In contrast to the 18-page 'bumper' paper 50 years ago this weekend we publish over 140 pages, including our Property Today supplement
