# Willie Casey triumphs in Toronto

LIMERICK pro-boxer Willie Casey is setting his sights on an Irish title fight as his stock continues to rise after his stretched his unbeaten record to five successive

The 28-year old Southill featherweight travelled to Canada last week and scored yet another knockout when defeating Canadian Superbantamweight champion, Tyson Cave.

The previously undefeated fighter went down to Casey at the 25th annual Shaw Festival in Toronto.


The third round knockdown I scored gave me the confidence to push on and I pressurised him from then on and stopped him gaining any sort of rhythm in the fight," said a delighted Willie Casey.

The contest was initially scheduled for six rounds, but Casey and trainer Phil Sutcliffe agreed to a late switch

"We wanted an eightrounder all along even though it was originally down for six. It worked in my favour although I was still confident of stopping him over six rounds

The stoppage guaranteed my win because you never know how the judges are seeing it," explained the Limerick man.

'There are still a few things we need to work on of course, but overall it was a great experience. I had only seen brief video clips of Tyson before this fight. He was fast like we had

expected and had good movement; it was hard to get him into the corner as he was pretty slick.

If Casey reports no illaffects this week he could very well be back in the ring at the end of May.

"I'm eligible for the Irish title, but I think we'll maybe have another eight-rounder first," he said.

"I definitely want to fight on the May 29 DolPhil show in Dublin," said Willie Casey.

The Canadian fight saw him notch up his fourth knockout of his career when stopping Tyson Cave in the eight round.

Cave had won all of his 10 previous fights. The Canadian has started

well and appeared to be by out-boxing his Limerick opponent, but soon it became apparent that Cave couldn't handle the power of Casey.

Cave was dropped by a left hook in the third and also hit

the canvas in the seventh round.

The home town favourite was again dropped in the eight and final round by a vicious body shot and when he hit the canvas, the referee stepped in and called the fight for the Limerick man.

Casey is a former Irish intermediate featherweight champion, who is a former member of Our Lady of St. Saviour Boxing Club in

Casey who is being coached in Dublin by former Olympian and double European championship bronze medal winner Phil Sutcliffe is nicknamed 'The Big Bang' and is managed by Don O'Leary.

Meanwhile, there was underage success another member of the Casey family over the weekend. Sixteen-year-old Milo Casey won an All-Ireland boys title in the National Boxing Stadium with a win over Joe Sullivan of All-

The Our Lady of Lourdes-Saviour boxer had defeated an Offaly opponent in his semi-final.
