

TWO OF THE FAMOUS LEAHY BROTHERS



The above photograph, taken in the early days of the present century, includes two of the famous six County Limerick athletic brothers—the Leahys of Cregane—who shed lustre not only on their native county, but on Ireland in general. In the picture are:—Standing (left to right)—Mr. Michael Madigan, of Rathkeale, himself an athlete of high merit in his day, and Con Leahy, the world-famous high jumper.
