THE death has occurred of one of Limerick's bestknown legal and sporting personalities, Mr Dermot G O'Donovan.

Born on January 8, 1908, he was president of Garryowen FC in 1938 and he again held that office from 1957 to 1961, during which time the club moved to its present headquarters at Dooradoyle.

His remains will be removed this Friday from Thompson's Funeral Home at 7.30pm to Monaleen church. The funeral takes place to Kilmurry Cemetery after 12 o'clock Mass this Saturday.
