The BMW Round Ireland Yacht Race is one of the world's premier offshore yacht races and


offshore yacht races and the Super Zero class is fiercely competitive.

They finished over seven hours ahead of their nearest competitor but it wasn't all plain sailing for the crew says Mr O'Rourke.

They spent a total of eight days on the water in August and they covered over 1780 miles as they rounded Great Britain and Ireland.

Their next port of call was RORC Cascais, Portugal race on September where they again competed credibly. The yacht of the year award capped off a great sailing year for Mr O'Rourke and his crew and it is hoped that their success of 2006 can be replicated in 2007.
