For the first time Sean became county senior champion and later, in the All-Ireland senior event he and Michael helped Limerick to win the team prize.

Then came the '58-'59 season and Sean began by winning the county senior title for the third time in succession, while on the same day Michael won the F.C.A. Championship at Fermoy. The 1959-'60 cross-country season is still fresh in our minds. Michael "walked away" with the county senior cross-country championship.
