ALLEGED CHILD MURDER IN COUNTY LIMERICK.

Mr John S. Casey, Coroner for Co Limerick, held an inquest at Sunville, near Kilfinane, on Saturday evening on the body of an infant found in a pond at Sunville. A young woman named Elizabeth Sullivan, a domestic servant, has been arrested and lodged in Kilfinane Gaol, charged with causing the death of the infant. At the inquest District Inspector Magee, Kilfinane, deposed that on Thursday morning last, acting on information received, he visited Elizabeth Sullivan, who confessed that she had given birth to an illegitimate male child. She said it died after birth, and she then threw it into a pond, where the body was found. death from suffication was returned.
