CONSERVATORS'

DUTY

AND POWERS.

BY an Act passed in the thirty-sixth year of his present Majesty, it is enacted "That for the better preservation of public Roads from encroachments and nuisances, and for the more regular and effectual execution of the law, Conservators may be appointed by Grand Juries; and that any Sum presented for them, shall not be paid to any such Conservator, until he shall have laid (upon oath,) before the Grand Jury, in a book to be kept by him for the purpose, *a full and exact account of his proceedings in the execution of his Office*:— Stating when and how often he inspected each road within his district—What nuisances, encroachments, or breaches of this act he observed—What remedies he took to remove or punish for the same—What magistrates he applied to—What warrants he received, and what fines he levied, and whether any and what encroachments and nuisances, and

whether any and what ditches, walls, or houses, have been made or built, or pits dug within the time of his appointment, or since last Assizes, on any road, or nearer to the centre or sides thereof than this act permits—whether they continue so, and in general a true and perfect state of the roads, and bridges, and all other works and matters thereon erected or repaired by presentment.”—

And it shall be lawful for the Grand Jury to examine every such Conservator upon oath, touching any matter respecting the execution of his office, or the state of the road within his district ; and every such Conservator shall have all the power given by law to any Overseer, and shall be deemed the Overseer of all public works within his district ; and the several sub-constables are hereby required to aid and assist him in the execution of his duty when required ; and he is to report to the grand Jury any neglect of such assistance in any such sub-constable. And for every cart-load of dung, rubbish, or scouring, which have been laid on any public road, or within thirty-feet of the centre thereof, contrary to the provisions of this act, and which shall be drawn away by directions of any Conservator, after having remained therefor twenty-four hours, the person whom, or by whose order the same was laid there, or who shall be liable to penalty for the same being laid there, upon conviction before any Justice of the Peace within his ju-

risdiction, by the oath of one credible witness, shall forfeit the sum of one shilling for every day the same shall have remained there. And the Conservator and Sub-constable, within their respective jurisdictions, may seize and kill any cur-dog, mastiff, or bull-dog, which shall be kept near any public road, contrary to the provisions of the said act ; and if any person whatsoever shall be annoyed in passing or re-passing any public road, by any cur-dog, mastiff, or bull dog, which shall be kept near such road contrary to the provisions of said act, it shall be lawful for any such person to kill such cur-dog, mastiff, or bull dog, without being sued or prosecuted for the same. And if any person shall scour, deepen, widen, or fill up any ditch or drain on the side of any road, without the consent or directions of the Conservator appointed for the Barony ; or if any owner or occupier shall omit to scour any ditch or drain leading from any public road, so as to give full liberty for the water to pass away, within ten days after notice shall be given to him or her so to do by such Conservator, or shall permit or suffer the free passage of the water to be obstructed by making or having any way or passage from any road into the lands adjoining, or to his or her house, without sufficient pipe, sewer, or gullet underneath ; or shall ride or drive any horse, beast, or other cattle, willingly or unnecessarily, on any foot-path, or shall steep

or dry any flax, or burn any bricks or lime, or any weeds or vegetables for ashes, or build any lime-kiln on his or her land, within one hundred feet of the centre of any public road, or shall cut any turf, or make any turf-stack on any public road, within forty feet of the centre thereof, or shall build any wall, or make any ditch, or dig any pit on any public road, within thirty feet of the centre thereof, unless by authority of some presentment; or shall leave or permit to be left on any road opposite to, or near his or her house or offices, any plough or harrow, cart, car, dray, or other carriage, without the beast or beasts being harnessed thereto, unless such carriage shall have been accidentally broken down there, every person so offending, shall forfeit and pay the fines and penalties as mentioned in the said act.

FURTHER EXTRACTS

FROM THE

EXISTING ROAD ACTS.

36th Geo. III. Chap. 36.

69. **A**ND be it further enacted, "That it shall be lawful for any Justice of Peace in any County, any peace officer within their respective jurisdictions, or for any Overseers or Conservators of Roads, to seize and impound, or cause to be seized or impounded, any swine or beast which shall be found wandering on any public road; and in case the sum of 5s. and the expences of impounding and detaining the same, shall not be paid within four days after impounding the same, to cause such swine or beast to be sold, and out of the money arising from the sale thereof, to pay such penalty and expences of impounding, keeping, and selling the same, rendering the overplus, (if any.) to the owner; notice of such sale, (in which shall be inserted the names of the Parish and Townland, where such swine or beast was seized), being first posted up in some conspicuous place in the Parish where seized, and at the place where impounded, forty-eight hours at least before the time of sale."

70. AND, be it further enacted, "That no house or part of a house, shall be built within thirty feet of the centre of any road, or within fifteen feet of the side thereof; except in streets or corporate towns,) and that if any person shall build, or begin to build, or proceed in building any house or part of a house, within such distance, every such person shall forfeit the sum of ten Pounds, and the further sum of twenty Shillings for every week afterwards, until the same shall be pulled down or removed: to be recovered before any Justice of the Peace as aforesaid."

71. AND, be it further enacted, "That no lime-kiln shall be built within one hundred feet of the centre of any public road, and that it shall be lawful for any Grand Jury as aforesaid, or Justices at a Sessions of the Peace, to direct any house or lime-kiln, built or building, contrary to this or any other act hereby repealed, to pull down and to issue orders to any Constable or Constables for that purpose, which every High and other Constables shall aid and assist in executing."

72. AND, be it further enacted, "That the centre of the road within the provisions of this act, shall be deemed to be the centre of the part thereof made with gravel or small stones."

73. AND, be it further enacted, "That if any person shall wilfully destroy, pull up, deface, or

injure any mile-stone, mile-post, and direction-post or any bridge, battlement, wall, railing, mound, or fence, erected or repaired by presentment; or shall wilfully break, deface, pull down, or take away stones out of any such bridge, &c. built or repaired by presentment, he or she shall forfeit for every such offence, upon conviction, by the oath of a credible witness, before a Justice of the Peace, within their jurisdictions, or upon view of such Justice of the Peace, such sum not exceeding five pounds, as such Justice might think fit."

85. AND, be it further enacted. "That the Contractor or Contractors, for keeping any part of any public road in repair, shall have all the powers given by Law to any Overseer or Conservator of the roads, and shall be deemed the Overseer of all parts of the road, for which he has or shall Contract, during the continuance of such Contract."

89. AND, be it further enacted, "That all fines and forfeitures inflicted by virtue of this act, if not immediately paid, shall be levied by distress and sale of the offender's goods by warrant under the hand and seal of a Justice of the Peace, together with all expences attending the levying of the same; and all such fines, unless otherwise specially directed by this act, shall, when levied and paid, be given, one-half to the informer, and the other half

to the poor of the Parish wherein the offence shall have been committed ; and that in case any fine be not immediately paid upon conviction, it shall be lawful for the Justice of the peace before whom such conviction shall have been made, to commit the offender to gaol, there to remain without bail or mainprize for any time not exceeding two months or until the fine be paid.

The Memorial of the Committee of the Limerick
House of Industry

MOST RESPECTFULLY SHEWETH,

THAT the Limerick House of Industry was instituted under and by virtue of the 11th and 12th GEO. III. ch. 30.

THAT the only public Funds provided for its support, are presentments of 400l. from the County and 200l. from the City of Limerick.

THAT these Funds are wholly inadequate to the proper maintenance of an establishment which comprehends a work-house for Paupers and Vagrants, a Nursery School for deserted Children, a Lock-Hospital, and a retreat for the Insane.

THAT so early as 1783, the presentments, (which form the only public support of the Limerick House of Industry,) were declared, by an act

of Parliament then passed, to be insufficient for the charitable purposes for which they were intended; and the Grand Juries of Counties and of Cities were required to present such additional sums as the going Judges of Assizes might think necessary, not exceeding 100*l.* each.

THAT in 1806, by the 46th GEO. III. chap. 95, this power is further extended to sums not less than 400*l.* or more than 500*l.* in a City; and not less than 500*l.* nor exceeding 700*l.* in a County at Large, together with 200*l.* annually for a Lunatic Assylum: these presentments are only to be made on the recommendation of the Judge.

THAT the neighbouring Counties of Cork, Waterford, and Tipperary, have, under the direction of the Court, complied with the provisions of this Statute, as by the annual statements of the Charitable Institutions in these places more fully appears.

THAT unless some augmentation in the grants of the County and City of Limerick takes place at the present Assizes, your Petitioners apprehend that the Establishment which they conduct will fall into decay. The state of the Building requires immediate repair and improvement, and the Funds are in themselves wholly insufficient for the general purposes of the Institution.

YOUR Petitioners intreat the Honorable the GRAND JURY, to give effect to the prayer of this Memorial, by providing adequate Funds for an Establishment of vast public importance, which at present stands very peculiarly in need of liberal assistance.
