Limerick's internationally acclaimed singer returns!

THE long-awaited return to her home town by Limerick's internationally acclaimed opera singer Suzanne Murphy takes place on Thursday, July 5. Suzanne performs at the Rossbrien Marquee on Old Crescent RFC's grounds in this year's Limerick Summer Music concert.



Suzanne has performed lead roles in all the major opera houses throughout Europe and the Americas (North & South) during a stellar career for which she was awarded Honorary Doctorates from University of Limerick, Cardiff University, University of Glamorganshire and the Royal Welsh College of Music & Drama, where she directs the opera programme, for her work in music education.

Her most recent performance took place with Irish National

Opera's five productions of The Marriage of Figaro (Mozart) in the role of 'Marcellina' at Wexford Opera House and The Gaiety, Dublin for which she received great acclamation and a warm welcome back on the opera stage after an absence of 15 years since her last opera performance.

When she left school at FCJ Convent, Bruff she joined the Cecilian Musical Society and appeared in many of their presentations of annual musicals being cast in some of the minor singing roles.

On her move to Dublin she formed the very popular folk group WE4 with fellow Limerick musician Larry Hogan and achieved great country wide success and also in the UK appearing as guests on many RTE

and BBC TV programmes. When the group broke up she pursued a successful solo singing career before entering the operatic world as a much in demand coloratura soprano.
