A Washington telegram states that the Repub-  
lican members of the Ways and Means Committee  
of the House of Representatives have completed  
the draft of the projected Tariff Bill, by which  
the tobacco tax is reduced to the extent of  
410,500,000 dols. The Bill, which has not yet been  
reported to the full committee, also provides a  
lower schedule for sugars, making an average  
reduction of 50 per cent. in the sugar duty. The  
framers of the measure estimate that it will re-  
duce the revenue by 60,000,000 dols. of which  
the amount from 26,000,000 to 27,000,000 dols. are  
secured by the reduction in sugar, and from  
17,000,000 to 19,000,000 dols. by readjustment of  
the internal revenue.
