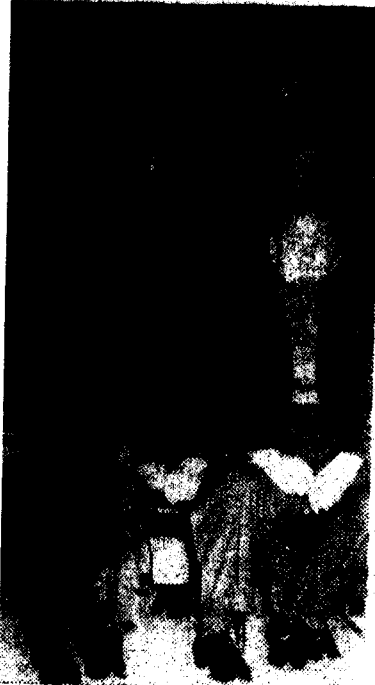

## BLOW OF A HURLEY: FINE IMPOSED

WHERE are people lying dead in the country because of being struck on the head by hardy blows of a hurley, Justice Gleeson stated at the City Court to-day, when he imposed a fine of £10 on Sean Hanly, 16 New Street, Kildimo, for assaulting Patrick Berkery, Mental Hospital, Limerick, by striking him on the head with a hurley during the course of a hurling game between the Mental Hospital and Kildimo at the Gaelic Grounds on 9th September.

Mr. M. Feeley gave evidence confirming Berkery, who, he said, was a patient in the Co. Infirmary from 24th September to 2nd October. Berkery was suffering from a scalp wound, which necessitated the use of stitches. The injury was not serious.

# Strong Case For University College In Limerick

A STRONG case for the establishment in Limerick of a Constituent College of the National University was made at a recent meeting of the Limerick Federation of the Irish Countrywomen's Association. The decision came to at that meeting was endorsed at a Council meeting of the Association held in Ennis this week.

At the Council meeting of the Irish Countrywomen's Association held at the Queen's Hotel, Ennis, the resolution passed by the Limerick Federation of the I.C.A. was put to a vote.

### THE RESOLUTION.

The resolution was: "That we, the members of the Limerick Federation, I.C.A., entirely approve of any effort made to secure a subsidiary college of the National University of Ireland for Limerick City."

Mrs. Cooper (Limerick Liberties T.A.) put the motion to the meeting. She stressed the fact that during the past decade the population of Limerick increased by almost 10,000, and that parents in Limerick and the adjoining counties were crying out for this amenity.

### SUPPORT FROM DEPUTY KEYES

Mrs. O'Grady (Dublin T.A.) read a letter from Mr. M. J. Keyes, T.D., in which he said that for years past there had been a strong demand for a University College in Limerick, and that if the people of Limerick persevere the people of Limerick will conquer.

Mrs. Murray (Wicklow) also supported the motion.

### MOTION CARRIED

On a vote being taken, the motion was carried by twenty votes to sixteen.
