MR. HAROLD DERBER, of Manchester, who was deported by the American authorities for allegedly ferrying Cubans to Florida, told his story when he landed at Shannon Airport.

t all began back in Key West, Florida, where he was arrested aboard his boat and escorted into port, he said, by three destroyers, a weather ship and a coastguard vessel.
