Plaque is unveiled to 'almost forgotten hero' of the Old IRA

CAHERCONLISH

AN almost forgotten hero of the War of Independence in the Limerick area, Richard Leonard of Shrahane near Caherconlish, a member of the Mid-Limerick Brigade of the Old IRA, was honoured on Sunday when a plaque was unveiled and blessed at Ballybrood Cross near the spot where he was shot dead by Crown Forces in 1920.

Mr Leonard, a member of the fourth battalion, was shot twice in the back as he attempted to escape from custody following a raid on Michael Hogan's pub in Ballybrood. The event took place just five weeks before the Dromkeen ambush.

The plaque was unveiled by Michael Leonard of Clashbane and blessed by Fr Liam Ryan, Cappamore, former Professor of Sociology at NUI Maynooth.

Three wreaths were laid on behalf of the family, the Mid Limerick Brigade and by the Dromkeen Ambush committee. Michael Leonard is a member of that committee.

At Sunday's ceremony, historian Tom Toomey delivered a stirring account of the events that led to Mr Leonard's death.

'Coming from strong Republican stock and being a first cousin of Dick O'Connell, the O/C of the local battalion, it was not surprising that he joined Oglaigh na hEireann.

"His work as a schools attendance officer and as an insurance agent required that he travel a lot. This made him very useful for carrying dispatches and gathering information," Mr Toomey

Earlier on the day of the shooting a military court had been held at Cappamore RIC barracks to investigate the accidental death of Constable Patrick McGann, who had

own revolver.

Three officers from Cork involved in that inquiry had been drinking in Pallasgreen after the conclusion of the investigation, and before setting out for Bruff, they had made a detour and raided the Hogan pub after midnight. While he was being taken out to the car he made a break for freedom and as he ran, he was shot twice in the back, according to Mr Toomey

arrested.

"Dr John Corboy of Caherconlish was called, and, having examined the body, later gave evidence that the two entrance wounds were from the back," the historian said.

No report was filed by the

died after a discharge of his officers on the shooting at Ballybrood, but Dr Corboy reported his findings to the military authorities. But despite statements from 19 witnesses, the officers were cleared of murder.

The death of Richard Leonard was only one of a series of brutal killings that took place in the general Limerick area over the Christmas period of December 1920 to January 1921. Over that brief period, 11 volunteers were killed. The day of reckoning came five weeks later, when these men were fully avenged at Dromkeen,' said Mr Toomey.

Over 100 people attended the ceremony, and Mr Toomey said that it was fitting that "memorials such as these be erected to remind us that we are in debt to these great men and women of the
