attack, which was, on Saturday night, made upon a farmer near Gort in that County. The injured man is named Peter Roughan, and he resides between Gort and the village of Kindarra. Roughan is the holder of a small farm, and he has lately acted as a bailiff on an estate in the locality. The landlord, having failed to get his rent, has recently served his tenants with notices of ejection, and Roughan consequently fell into odium with his neighbours. About nine o'clock on Saturday night Roughan was walking towards his own home along the public road when suddenly two men jumped up from behind a low wall and without a word of warning, presented guns and fired full at the bailiff, who started back just in time to escape the centre of the charge of shot. Roughan was, however, struck with several of the pellets, and his assailants fled without waiting to see the effect of their fire. No arrests have yet been made, but it is believed that the injured man will identify his assailants, and the police are prosecuting a vigorous inquiry. Roughan's life is not considered to be in danger as he has not been wounded in any vital part.
