OUR COUNTRY COLUMN

Before summarising the results of the experiment carried out by the Department to test this matter, it may be well to state that the most important conclusion to be drawn from this, and previous experiments (conducted with the object of determining the most economical method of feeding calves from four to six weeks old, until the calves are weaned at from five to six months old) is that calves can be reared successfully and economically on foods produced on the farm.

NEWCASTLE WEST FIFTY YEARS AGO.

The following interesting account of Newcastle West and district is taken from Slater's Royal National Commercial Directory of Ireland, 1870.

TYLERS and the Public
AN ANNOUNCEMENT THAT DOES CONCERN YOU.
When leather prices soared and boots were difficult to procure, Tylers did not profiteer, but positively refused to alter their fixed stamped prices on goods in stock.
