The October pig market in Newcastle West was of large dimensions, about 1,100 pigs being on sale. Prices ranged from 26 to 26 10s. per cwt.; there was a very large supply of bonhams, about 100 rails in market; prices, 23 to 24 each.

ABBEYFEALE GREAT SEPTEMBER FAIR.

This great September cattle fair contained large supplies in every grade, second class stock predominating. The tone of the fair was despondent, and the loss attributable to present railway derangements and depressing markets was immense. In store departments some stock were disposed of at half the prices obtainable in April and May. Bulls in various stages of condition went from 28 to 220; one sold at 29 10s. commanded a price of 221 last April. A few springers were sold at 235 to 237 10s., and those that might have easily secured 245 some time ago were transferred at 220 to 223. Some lamches of three year old bullocks obtained 215 to 216 10s. each. 2nd calf dairy cows, calving April and May, realised 215 to 219 inferior classes less; year and a half, 210 to 214; yearlings, 20 to 210; lambs, 50s. to 65s.; sheep, 2 10s. to 25 10s. each. At the pig market 1,100 pigs were purchased at 26 to 26 5s.

Newcastle West.

A very special meeting of the above was held at Newcastle West, on Saturday, 24th September. The object of the meeting was to discuss the pros. and cons. of a new programme which has been submitted to teachers for use in National Schools.

After much discussion it was proposed by Mr. J. B. O'Connell and seconded by Mr. J. Abernethy:—"That while we approve of the general trend of the programme and premise to do everything in our power to give our National Language its proper place in the curriculum of our schools, we think the programme as it stands utterly unattainable, as being overloaded with too many subjects. That in comparison with the National Board's programme, which we have always held to be overloaded, we consider this programme more overloaded and less capable of attainment."

The proposition was carried unanimously. There was also a discussion regarding the present system of heating and cleaning our National Schools.

Proposed by Mr. Michael Egan, seconded by Mr. Maurice O'Mahony:—"That while we consider the present system of heating and cleaning our National Schools most unsatisfactory we consider the present time inopportune for taking any drastic action with this matter."

Passed unanimously. The Chairman (Mr. G. J. Ambrose) said he had a very painful duty to perform, and that was to propose a vote of condolence with their very worthy member, Mr. M. B. O'Donnell, Head Master, The Courtenay Schools. He proposed the following:—"That we, the members of the Newcastle West Associated Teachers, beg to tender to Mr. O'Donnell and family our deepest sympathy in the great affliction he and they have sustained by the death of Mrs. O'Donnell."

Mr. J. O'Shea seconded the resolution, which was passed in silence.

BELFAST BOYCOTT.

Meeting at Kilmallock. At a meeting of the local committee organized to deal with matters relating to the Belfast boycott representatives were present from Kilmallock, Glenroe, Kilmallock, Burren, Burren and Dromin.

An Organiser from the Dublin Central Committee was also in attendance. Several matters of importance having been dealt with, it was decided to request the Republican police to take definite steps in the immediate future to cope with all known branches of the boycott order, and to report the result of their investigations to the next meeting of the local Boycott Committee.

AMERICA'S UNEMPLOYED.

The "Daily Express" correspondent, wiring from New York on Monday, says:—The conference called by the Government, under the chairmanship of Mr. Hoover, to deal with the American unemployment problem, opened this morning at Washington. Representatives of labour, capital and the Government will endeavour to find a scheme for giving work to more than 2,000,000 workers who are now idle.
