**FATAL RAILWAY ACCIDENT NEAR NEWCASTLE-
WEST**—An inquest was held yesterday on the
body of a young lady named Wright, who was
run over by a train on Saturday night. It
appears that Miss Wright was crossing the line
at Shanagarry, a place about one mile outside
the town, when the train due from Tralee at 5
o'clock suddenly came upon her, and knocking
her down completely severed both legs from her
body. There is a sudden bend in the line at the
place where the unfortunate lady sought to
cross, and she was therefore unaware of the
proximity of the approaching train. The driver
could not have seen the girl until he was almost
upon her, and until he was powerless to avert the
calamity. After hearing the evidence the jury
returned a verdict of accidental death, and
attached no blame whatever to the driver. The
deceased was the only daughter of a widow lady,
and great sympathy is felt for Mrs Wright.
