**LIMERICK—WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 5.**

The Hon. W. W. Quin, M. P. has arrived at his seat, Adare, in this County, from London.

A Dublin Paper of Monday states, that Doctor Broderick, the Archbishop of Cashel, who performed the archiepiscopal duties of Dublin during the long illness of Dr. Cleaver, will be translated to that archbishoprick.

Lieutenant-General Sir Alexander Campbell, Bart. is destined to take the command of the troops on the Madras station, in place of Sir Thomas Hislop, who is on his way home. Sir Alexander will sail early in the ensuing Spring.

Colonel Sir Patrick Ross, 75th Regiment, is appointed Grand Master of the Order of St. Michael of Sicily.

The 33d have moved to Newark, the 63d to Broomsgrove, and the 5th Veteran Battalion to Plymouth.

The two troops of the 9th Lancers, and the division of the 90th foot, ordered last week from Newcastle to Macclesfield, have returned to their former quarters, where it is expected they will winter.

The Coldstream Regiment of Guards mounted duty on the parade, in St. James's Park, on Saturday morning in their new clothes. The appearance of long tailed coats, which is the principal new feature in them, attracted considerable notice.

The 10th Royal Veterans, composed of Pensioners from the Cities of Limerick and Cork, Counties of Limerick, Clare, Cork, Tipperary, Waterford, Kerry, Carlow, and Kilkenny, amounting to 1,100, were inspected by Major-General Gordon, at Fermoy, on Sunday, when a selection of 100 being beyond the complement, were put aside to be discharged. Colonel Hooper, late of the 87th regt. commands the Battalion, which it is thought will shortly proceed for England.

All the women who left Ireland with the 92d Regiment, have fallen victims to the fever at Jamaica, as well as 297 rank and file. The fever was not prevalent in the 61st, though, with some privates, a Captain, his wife, and two children, have been consigned to their graves by the same most awful visitation.

An altercation took place between a female and male servant, in a House in William-Street, a few evenings ago, when the former struck the latter named Pat Barry, with a metal pot cover, which caused his death in the County Hospital, on Monday—an inquest was held on his body by the Mayor, and a verdict returned to the above effect.

The *Albury* transport arrived at Cove on Saturday, to take settlers on board from Ireland for the Cape of Good Hope.

At the General Meeting on Monday last, on examining the books of the Castle-Council Dispensary for the year 1819, it appeared that 2169 prescriptions had been made up during that period. The utility of such an Institution needs no comment.
