On Sunday last an inquest was held at Ballinvialla, by James Bennett, Esq. coroner, on the body of Judith Shanahan, who committed suicide under the following circumstances:—It appeared from the evidence that the unfortunate young woman was observed walking in an adjoining field the previous evening, soon after which she rushed into a neighbour's house, exclaiming she had poisoned herself, and there expired in a few moments in great agony. Doctor Peate examined the body of deceased, and stated she came by her death from having taken a quantity of sulphuric acid; the jury returned a verdict accordingly. No cause can be assigned for the fatal act; it appeared, however, she attempted to destroy herself about two years since, when she cut her throat in a frightful manner.

The council of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, assembled on the 10th of January inst., conferred the dignity of Fellowship on Morgan David O'Connell, Esq. M.D. of Kilmallock.

At Galway Sessions, Assistant Barrister Freeman made a rule which he has declared his intention never to relax, that all persons applying to be registered must come into court with the registry certificate prepared and ready for signature.

At the request of the inhabitants of Tuam, W. D. Freeman, Esq. Q.C. Assistant-Barrister, has applied for a resident Stipendiary Magistrate in that town.

At Tralee Quarter Sessions, Assistant-Barrister M'Dermott sentenced Jeremiah Sullivan and Ellen Cahill to 7 years' transportation, for robbery of £10 and other funds from Timothy Cahill, in that town. In the case of two men tried for an assault on a missionary Scripture reader, and tearing his bible to fitters, the jury could not agree. The Court upon appeal reversed the decision of Killorglin petty sessions, and ordered the prostration of the salmon weir at the mouth of the Laune river, at the cost of the trespassers.

A case came on in the Civil Bill Court, Tralee, in which Mr. John Busted was plaintiff, and twelve corn merchants of the town defendants. The cause of action arose out of the corn merchants not frequenting the corn market established by Mr. Busted, and to which, as alleged, they pledged themselves. Mr. Lynch attended on the part of the corn merchants, and the barrister dismissed the case on the merits.
