A PROCLAMATION.

WESTMORLAND.

WHEREAS the certificate of an indictment found by the Grand Jury of the County of Limerick, at an Assizes held at St. Francis' Abbey, in and for the county of Limerick, the 31st day of July, 1790, before the Honourable William Henn Esq; second Justice, and the Honourable Sir Samuel Braddree, Bart. third Justice of his Majesty's court of King's Bench in Ireland, hath been laid before us, by which it appears that William Lane of Manisterra in the said County of Limerick, Gent. stands indicted for feloniously assaulting and committing a Rape on Lucinda Clanchy, Spinster, of the Age of Thirteen Years, the only Daughter and Heiress of John Clanchy, late of Ballyguiletaghill in the said County, Gent. deceased, on the 13th Day of April last past.

NOW we, the Lord Lieutenant and Council, having a just Abhorrence of such criminal and felonious Proceeding, do, by this our Proclamation, publish and declare, that if any Person or Persons shall, on or before the Tenth Day of March next, apprehend and lodge in any of his Majesty's Gaols in this Kingdom the said William Lane, such Person or Persons shall receive as a Reward the Sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS Sterling.

AND we do hereby strictly charge and command all Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, and other His Majesty's loving Subjects, to be aiding and assisting in apprehending the said William Lane.
