

DEATHS.

On Sunday last, at his residence, Leamington, deeply and universally regretted, Colonel Richard Kane Croker, formerly of the 18th Hussars, in which Regiment he served with distinguished bravery during the whole of the Peninsular war. He was severely wounded at Toulouse, and subsequently most dangerously so at Waterloo, where he was promoted on the field to the Majority of the Regiment. Colonel Croker was second son of the late Edward Croker, Esq. of Ballynagarde, and Margaret, sister of William, Earl of Listowel.

This morning, at his residence, Willow Bank, near Limerick, to the inexpressible regret of his family and neighbours, Capt. Bartholomew Hickie, on full pay, late of the 7th Royal Veteran Battalion. He served in the 1st Light Infantry in the Peninsula campaigns, during which he was severely wounded, besides losing his right arm. His death will be poignantly felt by the poor, to whom he was a liberal and constant benefactor. He died in peace and hope of a joyful resurrection, thro' the atoning merits of his Redeemer. His remains will be interred at Kilmurry Church, on Tuesday next, at half-past 11, forenoon.
