indulgence, and refrain from any further viola-
tions of the Laws, which must ever terminate
to their disadvantage.

Since the restrictions of the Insurrection Act
have been withdrawn from Kerry, that County
continues in a peaceable state; and it is ear-
nestly hoped that Government will encourage
the good disposition of the peasantry by afford-
ing aid to the agricultural and commercial inter-
ests in that quarter.

Denis Sheehan, a workman in Mr. William
White's Store, in Brunswick-Street, accident-
tally fell, on Thursday evening, from the trap-
door six stories high, and was killed on the
spot. An inquest was yesterday held on the
body, and a verdict returned accordingly.

The body of a woman named Mary Dwyer,
was yesterday morning observed floating in the
Canal. An inquest was held in the course of
the day, and a verdict returned—"Found
drowned." It appeared in evidence that she
deceased was a servant maid, and left her ser-
vice about six weeks past, since which period
she had not been heard of.

Same day a third inquest was held on the
body of Samuel Baverley, a private of the 3d
Dragoon Guards, who died in the morning in
a convulsive fit at the Barracks, verdict—"Died
by the visitation of God."

Maurice Brien, the principal in the abduction
mentioned in our last has absconded, but infor-
mations have been sworn against him before
Samuel Maxwell, Esq. and the Police are on the
search for him. He is about 23 years of age,
five feet eight inches high, and pale faced.

A poor man, named Leahy, who lives at
Carrah-bridge, was waylaid and attacked on
Monday evening, while returning from the
Petty Sessions of Pallas-Kerry, by nine or ten
fellows, who beat him in a most unmerciful
manner with sticks and stones, leaving the unof-
fending creature for dead upon the road. They
departed, but returned in a few minutes to see
whether there was any sign of life in him, and
threw several heavy stones upon him. In this
state the unfortunate man was discovered shortly
after, and removed to a place of safety. He
continues in a most precarious condition, and
none of his persecutors have been yet discovered.

On Wednesday last, a gun, in good order,
was found on the estate of T. and W. Gabbett,
Esqrs. in this County, in a stack of straw, which
was lately made up close by the residence of
Ryan, who was murdered near Cahirconlish, as
reported in October last. The gun was given
up to Major Wilson, of Cahirconlish House.

The lower part of the town of Tralee was
completely inundated from the effects of the
gale, on Monday night, and some of the poorer
classes suffered severely from the storm; a poor
man named Ahern, was blown into the canal by
its violence, and was unfortunately drowned.
