Messrs. Gubbins, Chadwick, of Tipperary; Bevan, of
Camass, and many of the surrounding gentry in their
carriages with crape weepers. The Protestant and
Roman Catholic clergymen from the parishes of Bruff,
Knockany, and Hospital, attended, wearing scarfs and
hatbands; the cavalcade was closed by a multitude of
the neighbouring peasantry, who came in to show a
last token of respect to the deceased. The funeral was
conducted by Messrs. Charles James and Son, of
George's-quay.
