An Inquest was held on Monday last, before
John Cox, Esq. Coroner, aided by Richard
Walter Mason, Esqrs. and an intelligent jury,
of which Captain Nash was foreman, on the body
of Richard Morrison, of Lisduane, who was
found in a dyke by the Police, unable to speak.
A verdict of Wilful Murder against Thomas
Roche, who has absconded, was returned.

On Thursday morning, a fine looking female,
named Hannah Shanny, was found drowned in
the Canal—it appeared in evidence before the
Coroner, that she left her home at five o'clock
that morning, and was depressed in spirit, as
consequence of a person who promised her mar-
riage, having entered into union with another
woman the previous night. "Verdict"—
drowned herself that morning, while in a state
of mental derangement, occasioned by disap-
pointment in love.

On Wednesday night, a man named Mathew
Malone, in crossing the Shannon at Killaloe,
fell out of the boat and perished. He was con-
sidered a most expert boatman, and made his
livelihood chiefly of fishing, at which he was
equally ingenious, and was generally sought for
by Gentlemen frequenting the Lakes. The
unfortunate man has left a wife and eight chil-
dren. Contributions, (however small,) will be

business, to save herself and children from
starving.

In the absence of the Coroner, Lord Carbery
and another Magistrate held an inquest on Sa-
turday, on the body of John Shaughan, killed
at Curraheen, on the 14th instant. A verdict of
wilful murder was returned against Cornelius
Cadogan, John Lohori, and John Scully.
