Parliament will assemble on Thursday next before her Majesty in person, who will deliver the Royal Speech, which may be deemed the authentic herald of the political views and measures of the new Ministry in the coming session. The King of Prussia will attend on this important occasion.

His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant will hold a Levee at Dublin Castle, on Tuesday, 22nd February.

The City Dublin election will conclude this day, in the return of William Gregory, Esq. of Coole, county Galway.

Judge Torrens has polled for Mr. Gregory; the Chief Baron, Baron Richards, Master of the Rolls, and Mr. R. Moore, Q.C. for Lord Morpeth.

Thomas P. Maunsell, Esq. M.P. and Stafford Augustus O'Brien, Esq. M.P. Representatives of Northamptonshire, North, have signed the address from this county, both having considerable landed interest therein, to his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant.

One hundred and seventy lace dresses prepared at Mr. Lloyd's factory in this City, were worn by the Ladies at His Excellency's Drawing-room, Dublin Castle, on Wednesday last.

The Wellesley Bridge Commissioners have resolved to memorial the Board of Works upon the unprotected state of shipping in this harbour.

It is stated that £2,000 will scarcely repair the injury sustained by the Wellesley Bridge on Wednesday morning.

The journeymen shiprights of this port, aware of the harvest which the late hurricane has prepared for them, struck work, and refuse to take on, unless at 7s. 6d. a-day wages.

In the storm on Wednesday morning, the *Ann*, of this port, whilst lying at Clare river, was driven from its moorings, when the Captain, and Mr. Robert Alton, of this city, were washed overboard.
