EBRILL BROS SALES OF LAND AND GRAZING

At the Agricultural Hall to-day, Messrs Ebrill Bros., held their weekly sale of land and grazing lettings. One holding was offered for sale consisting of part of the lands of Gorboy containing 52 acres statute, held in fee-simple. The bidding for this lot started at £250 and went rapidly up to £400, when the holding was withdrawn for sale by private treaty. Mr T O'Brien had carriage of sale.

The grazing lands of Coolroe, Corbally, were then offered for sale and reached the high figure of £10 5s. The Grazing lands of Bokerode, Ballyneety, made £10 per acre, and some tillage lands on the same holding made £10 10s per acre. The result of these sales was considered most satisfactory.

LIMERICK DRAPERS' ASSISTANTS.

At the annual meeting of the Limerick Drapers' Assistants Association on Thursday, Mr M J Lenihan, presiding, the report of the Secretary showed an increase of 102 members, and the credit balance stood at £47 4s 5d.

It was decided on a division to change the name of the Association to the Irish Shop Assistants and Clerks Association.

AIRCRAFT WORK IN IRELAND.

Mr Field was officially informed in Parliament that it was proposed to utilise Irish resources for certain firms of aircraft work, and some orders had been placed. It was not possible to adopt the scheme suggested by the Dublin Coachmakers Society for construction of aircraft in Irish railway, where other work is suspended, and in coachbuilding factories. It is stated that Messrs Ashenhurst and Williams, Baggott street, and G A Brittain, Marlfort terrace, Dublin, will start making aeroplanes for an English firm of contractors in a couple of weeks.
